

What is a 'Level 2' Qualification?

GCSE's and BTECs are Level 2

- ► GCSE's are traditional qualifications most are 100% examination based.
- GCSE's are graded 9 1
- BTEC's are more vocational in nature and have elements of coursework.
- ▶ BTEC's are graded as L2P pass, L2M merit, L2D distinction or even L2D*!



Sixth Form requirements:

- ▶ Minimum five grade 4 passes for a <u>vocational</u> pathway.
- ► Minimum five grade 5 passes for an <u>A-Level</u> pathway.
- A-Levels require a higher grade in their subject.

English A-Level = grade 6 GCSE English Literature

Maths A-Level = grade 7 GCSE Maths

Science A-level = grade 6/6 GCSE Combined Science



All courses require a grade 4 in English and Maths.

- 1. Get a Casio calculator (Mr Barlow sells them for £10 each).
- 2. Maths Clinic runs every Tuesday after school.
- 3. Remember, the only way to learn maths is to do maths. Copying notes, etc, does not work!!!
- 4. Homework is set every week as a mix of MathsWatch or past paper questions. These are not optional!
- 5. All past papers / worked solutions / video solutions are available on the MathsGenie website: https://www.mathsgenie.co.uk/papers.html this is a great way to get a feel for exam questions (and realise they're always pretty much the same).

5 tips for Science – Mr Horne

The exam board is AQA

- 1. Do Tassomai every school day hit 5 Daily Goals per week.
- 2. Exam paper homework every week hand in on TUESDAYS
- 3. After school intervention on Thursdays afterschool
- 4. Use <u>www.freesciencelessons.com</u> to revise never fails!
- 5. Each subject has six required practicals make sure you have revised them as they equal at least one grade!
